Adverbs

Directions: Underline the adverb in each sentence.

An **adverb** is used to describe how, where, when, how often and why something happens.
It describes verbs, other adverbs, adjectives, and phrases.

Describing a Verb: The cat climbed **quickly** up the tree. (quickly describes the verb - climbed)

Describing a Adverb: Mike worked **very** carefully on his paper. (very describes the adverb - carefully)

Describing a Adjective: She is **nearly** ready to go. (nearly tells to what extent she is ready)

If you are unsure which word is the adverb, look for :

How something happens.

Where something happens.

Tip:

When something happens.

How often something happens.

Why something happens.
