Object pronouns replace the person or thing affected with: **me, you, him, her, it, us, or them**.

Tip **Subject** pronouns replace who or what the sentence is about with: **I, you, he, she, it, we or they**.

Possessive pronouns replace a noun and show ownership: **mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, theirs**.
