# Pronouns

A **pronoun** is a word that takes the place of a noun.

**Commonly used pronouns include:** **you, he, she, it, we, us, our, I, me, they, them, him, her**

**Pronoun** My mother rented a videogame for **my brother and me**.

**Example:** My mother rented a videogame for **us**.

**Object** pronouns replace the person or thing affected with: **me, you, him, her, it, us, or them**.

**Tip** **Subject** pronouns replace who or what the sentence is about with: **I, you, he, she, it, we or they**.

**Possessive** pronouns replace a noun and show ownership: **Mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, theirs**.
