1732	Born in Westmoreland County, Virginia to a planter family, Washington learned the morals, manners, and body of knowledge requisite for an 18th century Virginia gentleman. He pursued two intertwined interests: military arts and western expansion.
1738	At 16 he helped survey Shenandoah lands for Thomas, Lord Fairfax.
1754	At 22 years of age he was commissioned a lieutenant colonel, to fight the first battles of what grew into the French and Indian War.
1759	For the next 16 years Washington managed his lands around Mount Vernon and remained somewhat distant from politics. Washington married Martha Dandridge Custis. George and Martha had a good marriage, and together raised her two children from her previous marriage.
1775	The Second Continental Congress elected Washington Commander in Chief of the Continental Army. Washington assumed command of the Continental Army in the field at Cambridge, Massachusetts, and embarked upon the Revolutionary war that was to last six grueling years.
1781	American Revolution ends with American victory in Yorktown, Virginia with British recognition of the United States independence.
1783	The Treaty of Paris was signed. This treaty officially recognized the independence of the United States from British rule. Washington disbanded his army and gave a farewell address to his soldiers. Washington retired to Mount Vernon, but not for long.
1787	Washington presided over the Philadelphia Convention that drafted the United States Constitution in 1787 because of general dissatisfaction with the Articles of Confederation.
1789	Washington took the oath of office as the first President under the Constitution for the United States of America on April 30 at Federal Hall in New York City. John Adams was elected Vice President and would later become the second President of the United States.
1797	Washington leaves office of the President after 2 terms.
1799	Washington enjoyed less than three years of retirement at Mount Vernon, for he died of a throat infection in December.
